Hexham Abbey Singing Project

Well done to all HMS and QEHS students who performed in the Hexham Abbey Singing Project, which was part of the Hexham Abbey Festival of Arts and Music. Both schools performed a piece each and were then part of a large choir of 200 young people, made up of students from schools across Hexham and Corbridge. Together, they performed a piece called '1350' (a world premiere in fact!) which was written by local composer and teacher Fiona Lander. It told the story of the Abbey and its early history. All students were exemplary in their conduct. STEM

We were thrilled to welcome the Street Science STEM Outreach Team from Newcastle University, who put on their incredible Story of Earth show. From Earth's very first day 4.6 billion years ago, right through to the present, the show brought our planet's history to life with mind-blowing demonstrations. Our students were amazed by dry ice experiments, elephant's toothpaste, fire hands and more! The Year 5s were completely enthralled, and it was fantastic to see their excitement for science grow. A huge thank you to the Street Science team for bringing their energy and knowledge to our school.



Homework Update

We have had some feedback about the frequency of homework. We have been reflecting on this as a team as we never want homework to cause stress at home. We do believe in the value of purposeful homework to build pupils towards their high school years when studying at home will be essential. However, we want to get the balance right and build homework up as the children move through middle school. We have now updated our policy with a refreshed frequency of homework showing a gradual scale up from Year 5 to Year 8.

Teachers will also be sure to make homework expectations clear by sharing tasks on MCAS (we'll soon be launching the pupil version too!). Teachers will also make sure that necessary adaptations are made to tasks to promote independence. HMS Extra-Curricular Updates

New Club - KS2 Football

We have now been able to secure a coach with Full of Beans Fitness for a KS2 Football Club. This will take place on Wednesdays after school from 3.20 - 4.30. The football will take place in the large Sports Hall. Pupils must be wearing

PE kit. Bookings can be made on MCAS. The first date of the club will be Wednesday 2nd October. Spaces are limited to 20 pupils. There will be a wait list enabled. If you do not use MCAS or having difficulties, please contact a member of our Admin team and we will be happy to help. Please note, if the club proves popular we may choose to operate a rotation. Those that are not successful initially will be invited from the waitlist.

Mandarin School

We still have spaces for our Mandarin School which takes place on Wednesdays after school. This starts next week. It's open to all year groups. We have a native Mandarin speaker who comes to school from The Confucius Institute based in Newcastle University. This is a fantastic opportunity to learn a new language, which is fun for all involved. No experience is needed. This is a great way for pupils to meet others and make new friends. The club is free and high-quality resources are used by our tutor, Xinye. This could be the time your child realises a new linguistic talent or gains the confidence to participate.

Extracurricular Clubs Update

It has been wonderful seeing lots of clubs up and running now with a great buzz about the school - be that pupils rehearsing, engrossed in some physical activity, creating things or having fun playing in Dungeons and Dragons. A huge thank you must go to our staff who offer their own time after school. We also have the help of many volunteers and some outside companies that form a key part of our provision.

A few important polite reminders:

- Pupils being collected by parents/carers should meet at the main gates.
- It is the responsibility of parents/carers to know how their child will be getting home.
- Please try to be prompt in picking up your child. If you are late, your child will be asked to wait inside Fellside Building near the library until you arrive. We do not want pupils waiting in the car park.
- Pupils should only attend clubs where bookings have been confirmed on MCAS or by other contact with the school/club leader. We have had a few instances of pupils attending who have not applied or are currently on a waiting list. We obviously do not want to disappoint pupils, but some clubs have space limits, in order to ensure appropriate safeguarding.
- We are looking at clubs with large wait lists and will start to explore rotations, which we have operated in the
 past. This will allow us to provide maximum participation for all pupils that have expressed an interest. Parents
 are therefore advised to check the MCAS app for changes. We will endeavour to communicate with parents in
 good time when rotations will come to an end, so that alternative care arrangements can be made, if necessary.

French and Spanish Trip

Pupils have now been informed about which trip/trips they have been given a place for. If your child has a place on both trips, please can you have a conversation with them about which trip they might prefer. Of course, they are entitled to go on both trips. Deposit payments to secure your child's place on the trips will open on Monday 30th September and close on Friday 4th October. If you have any questions, please get in touch.
